Albert Pope helps start the League of American Wheelmen, By the 1890s, his Columbia Bicycle **Factory in Hart**ford, Connecticut, is reportedly producing one bike every minute.

The first world track-cycling championships are held in Chicago-10 vears before the inaugural Tour de France and three years before Paris-Roubaix.

Chicagobased Schwinn launches the Sting Ray. Kids begin taking them apart—and creating the first **BMX** bikes.

The United States gets its first world road champion when **Audrey McElmury** wins the women's race. The nation will wait until 1983 for its first male world road champ-Reno, Nevada's Greg LeMond.

Hippies + Schwinns + singletrack = the sport of mountain biking, invented in Marin County, California.

Connie Carpenter-**Phinney** wins the first women's Olympic road race at the Los Angeles Games.


Richland, Washington, hosts the first bike-polo world champs. (Sure, it's dorky, **but history** was made.)
