Extreme biking

Who pedals a bike 3,000 miles in 10 days with only a couple of hours of sleep per night? "Bicycle Dreams," an award-winning film by Stephen Auerbach, explores how and why endurance athletes tackle the Race Across America, deemed by Outside magazine the toughest sporting event in the world. The movie is not just about bicycling; it's a celebration of the human spirit. Autissier was the first Frenchman to enter RAAM and has crossed the finish line both as a solo competitor and a team entrant.
